Each chapter features a history, discography, music videos, music chart entries, radio sessions, television/film appearances, music press listings, and cover songs, as well as a sample of concert setlists. Foreword by Paul Court of The Primitives.

Siouxsie and The Banshees included mainstays Siouxsie Sioux, Steven Severin, and Budgie, joined by a variety of guitarists. Key albums: The Scream (1978), Kaleidoscope (1980), Juju (1981), Tinderbox (1986), Peepshow (1988). Key singles: Hong Kong Garden, Cities in Dust, Peek-a-Boo.

The Creatures were an offshoot of the Banshees, featuring Siouxsie and Budgie. Albums: Feast (1983), Boomerang (1989), Anima Animus (1999), Hai! (2003). Singles: Right Now, Standing There, 2nd Floor, Godzilla.

Altered Images, from Glasgow, Scotland, included Clare Grogan and multi-instrumentalist Stephen Lironi. Albums: Happy Birthday (1981), Pinky Blue (1982), Bite (1983). Singles: Happy Birthday, I Could Be Happy.

Cocteau Twins included Scots Robin Guthrie (production/guitar), Elizabeth Fraser (vocals), and Simon Raymonde (bass). Key albums: Head Over Heels (1983), Treasure (1984), Blue Bell Knoll (1988), Heaven or Las Vegas (1990), Four Calendar Café (1993).

Shop Assistants formed in Edinburgh, Scotland, with Alex Taylor (vocals), David Keegan (guitar), Sarah Kneale (bass), and Laura McPhail and Ann Donald (drums). Album: Shop Assistants/Will Anything Happen (1986). Singles: I Don't Wanna Be Friends With You, Safety Net EP.

The Fizzbombs featured singer Katy Lironi, Margarita Vasquez-Ponte (guitar), Angus McPake (drums), and Ann Donald (bass) from Shop Assistants. Singles: Sign on the Line, The Wild Rumpus flexidisc, Surfin' Winter EP (Sarah Kneale on bass).

The Motorcycle Boy featured vocalist Alex Taylor of Shop Assistants, who joined the instrumentalists from Meat Whiplash. Singles: Big Rock Candy Mountain , Trying To Be Kind.

The Flatmates, based in Bristol, featured guitarist Martin Whitehead, drummer Rocker, singer Debbie Haynes, and bassist Sarah Fletcher. Collections: Love and Death, Potpourri. Singles: Happy All the Time, Shimmer.

The Primitives formed in Coventry by guitarist Paul Court, vocalist Tracy Tracy, bassist Steve Dullaghan, and drummer Pete Tweedie, soon replaced by Tig Williams. Albums: Lovely (1988), Pure (1989), Galore (1992), Echoes and Rhymes (2012), Spin-O-Rama (2014). Singles: Really Stupid, Crash, Out of Reach, Lose the Reason.

The Darling Buds hailed from Caerleon, South Wales, near Newport. Albums: Pop Said... (1989), Crawdaddy (1990), Erotica (1992). Singles: Let's Go Round There, Crystal Clear.

The Heart Throbs formed in Reading, fronted by Rose Carlotti. Albums: Cleopatra Grip (1990), Jubilee Twist (1992), Vertical Smile (1993). Singles: Dreamtime, She's in a Trance.

Voice of the Beehive were a London band, fronted by California-born sisters Tracey Bryn and Melissa Brooke Belland. Albums: Let It Bee (1988), Honey Lingers (1991), Sex & Misery (1995). Singles: Don't Call Me Baby, I Say Nothing.

Shampoo formed in Plumstead, England, by Jacqui Blake and Carrie Askew, aided by a succession of collaborators (Lawrence Hayward, Con Fitzpatrick, Bob Stanley/Pete Wiggs of Saint Etienne). Albums: We Are Shampoo (1994), Girl Power (1995), Absolute Shampoo (2000). Singles: Trouble, Delicious.

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
